Switzerland's Largest University

The University of Zurich (UZH) was founded in 1883 "by the will of the people". With a current enrollment of over 26,500 students, UZH is now the largest university in Switzerland, and with around 100 subject areas on offer, it boasts the most comprehensive academic program in the country.

Twelve Nobel Prizes

The University's international standing is reflected in the many renowned academic distinctions conferred upon its members over the years, including 12 Nobel Prizes, one of which went to Albert Einstein.

Commitment to Health

The proximity between medical research and the clinical services provided in the University's four hospitals translates into first-rate medical care for the general population.

Research and Teaching

UZH's seven faculties and more than 150 academic departments are engaged in cutting-edge research. As a research university, UZH is also committed to research-based teaching.


Sharing Knowledge

Fostering Innovation


UZH supports the transfer of knowledge from research to industry and it encourages research and innovation in certain areas with research clusters and priority programs.








Graduate Campus – Transferable Skills

Example: UZH International Summer School

"Leadership in the Future of work"

Format:

- Three-week virtual journey through which nearly 50 participants from all around the world learn about good leadership practices, the Future of Work, and how to shape the future by collaborating with others
- Learning methods: a mix of instruction (lectures), reflection, group work, mentorship, workshops, new technologies (virtual reality)
- → 3 "milestones": Vision contest→ Road map→ Action Plan
- Lecturers:
 - External: Leading academics from the US, China and Europe.
 - UZH: Award-winning faculty from various disciplines
